C. Neutralize

- 3) When we have had a will contrary to the things of God, we need to exercise submission to the will of God (like in salvation.)
- 4) The command to go back and tell in Mark 5, and the command to not tell in Mark 7 are both <u>AGAINST</u>
 THE WILL OF THE HEARER

APPLICATION: Who sticks out to you the most as someone who went home early, before their ministry was over and before God intended them to? For me it is **MOSES**
