REVIEW:

A. Pleading. Mark 5:21-24

- 1) Jairus comes bring three things.
 - a) **PROBLEM**
 - b) **PLAN**
 - c) **PROCLAMATION**
- 2) Jesus responds
- 3) Faith always gets Jesus' attention
- 4) What is Jairus lacking?
- 5) So Jesus went with him; does this change anything with Jairus?
- 6) Until the action declared is accomplish, change doesn't come.
- 7) Sometimes Jesus declared the action, but other times like here Jairus and the woman did.
- 8) Now we are on our way to a solution, but a few surprises are ahead. Here's the first...

B. Drawing. Mark 5:25-34

- 1) The woman also comes to Jesus based on what she:
 - a) **HEARD**
 - b) **BELIEVED**
 - c) **PROCLAIMED**

- 2) (V. 28) For she said - Not just one time
- 3) My consistent actions are born of ...
 - a) **HABIT** [I always do it]
 - b) **DUTY** [I have to do it]
 - c) **FAITH** [desire to do it]
- 4) Confession is not repetitiously repeating **WHAT YOU HOPE**
- 5) It is **PROCLAIMING** what you have come to **BELIEVE**
- 6) Likely, she had a lot of people advising her as she spoke her faith out loud!
- 7) Sometimes what we say can be running from what we fear, instead of pursuing what we believe.
- 8) Just because we have prayed does not mean we are done.

C. Maintaining. Mark 5:35-43

- 1) “Your daughter is dead. **Why** trouble the Teacher any further?”
- 2) Immediately pressure comes to change the expectation

APPLICATION: **Hope** is **CREATED** by **HEARING** the promises in the Word.

Faith is **DEMONSTRATED** by **ACTING** on the truth of those promises you hear.

Expectation is **GENERATED** by **DECLARING** how that promise will come to me. (Mark 11:22-24)
